NRCPD V Registered Sign Language Interpreter

Case Summary

The NRCPD Complaints Committee considered allegations relating to the Registrant's competence in connection with interpreting provided during a medical consultation. The Committee reviewed the complaint, the Registrant's response, witness statements, correspondence from the treating doctor, and correspondence between PALS and the complainant's representative, together with other information gathered during the investigation.

Having considered all of the available evidence, the Committee concluded that there was no reasonable prospect of the allegations being proved. The Committee was not satisfied that the evidence was sufficient to establish that the Registrant had breached the NRCPD Code of Conduct.

Sanction / Resolution

The Committee determined that no further regulatory action should be taken and the case was closed.
